CAMPING CHECKLIST

Essentials

- **Tickets** You'd be silly to go without them... But not just your festival tickets. Coach, train & bus tickets - you'll need them all!
- **Photo ID** If you're planning on drinking any alcohol, make sure you bring a current photo ID that includes your date of birth.
- **Maps & Directions** The festival site will be fully signposted from all directions, but it wouldn't hurt to double check that map!
- **Cash & Cards** It's always best to get cash out before you arrive at the festival. Keep it safe - split it up into chucks in different bags & pockets.

Clothing

- **Waterproofs** Hevy will of course enjoy clear blue skies and sunshine, but just in case the unthinkable happens, probably best to bring these...
- **Wellies** A total must for any british festival, even if it's a scorcher! Now available in just about any colour...
- **Sun Glasses** Protect your eyes from the sun - or just hide a hangover! Cheap sunnies are the way to go - ones you don't mind sleeping on.
- **Hats** It's always a good idea to bring plenty of head gear to cater for all possible weather conditions.
- **Spare Clothes & Shoes** Take enough clothing for each day of the festival, enough for changing after muddy mishaps and a clean set for the trip home.

Camping Gear

- **Tent** Your home for the weekend! Make sure you know how to put it up and that you've got all the right pegs & pieces before leaving.
- **Sleeping Bag** This thing will seem like heaven after a whole day on your feet. Make sure the zip works and that it's clean before you pack it.
- **Roll Mat & Pillow** Having a mat & pillow to go with that sleeping bag will make your nights a lot more comfy. For the ultimate luxury try an air-bed!
- **Phone & Camera** It's likely to run out if you use it a lot, so try and stick to texts and leave it switched off while you sleep to save those vital bars.
- **Torch** Navigating back to your tent after an entire day of drinking is likely to end in disaster without light. You'll need one of these...
- **Chargers & Batteries** You don't want to run out of digital juice. There may be an area to re-charge your phone, but it's better to be safe than buggered!
- **Bin Liners & Laundry Bag** A few bin liners for rubbish and stuff will be really useful. Keep dirty clothes in their own bag to avoid ruining everything else.
- **Umbrella** It's the best thing for keeping rain off your morning barbecue or keeping dry as you wait in line for some much needed food.

| • Small Mirror | For finding out how muddy your face is. It's also handy for those brave enough to change their contact lenses in a tent. | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| • Insect Spray | These kind of repellents aren't essential but are definitely useful if you have allergies to insects and mosquitos. | <input type="checkbox"/> |
| • Prescription Medicine | Whether it's insulin or inhalers, make sure you have everything you need for the duration of the festival, and then some. | <input type="checkbox"/> |

| • Paracetamol | The morning after might be a long way away now, but you'll be thankful for packing them. Don't mix them with your drink. | <input type="checkbox"/> |
